



SRCS made history again with twin performances on December 13, 2015. In response to large crowds and conflicting schedules, the Board of Directors and Artistic Director, Barbara Perry, determined to offer our audience two options for enjoying the traditional presentation of highlights from Handel's *Messiah* along with seasonal music.

The move allowed the public to opt for either an afternoon or evening performance to better accommodate busy holiday schedules, and also allowed for more seating availability at each performance. All but a few singers powered through both performances, delivering standout entertainment to large crowds. Singers relaxed in between with a potluck meal generously hosted by the St. Peter's Chancel Choir. The orchestra and accompanist Kathryn Hichborn modeled the Christmas spirit with their enthusiastic participation in the entire day and helped to create a magical experience for all.

Feedback indicates a strong possibility of repeating the double performances again in 2016, so watch for the new season announcement coming in late summer!







Hello from Mooresville and Davidson, North Carolina (near Charlotte)

Well, its finally happened. After 15 year of living under the roof of SRCS and for a few years in the pre-SRCS era, I have moved out and am living on my own in another state.

Candidly, I thought there would be a huge adjustment, but fate has landed me in a town that has many similarities - and some differences - with the Fredericksburg area.

For example - we have a local college, Davidson. Very small, but with a very active music department. The college supports a college-community symphony as well as a joint choral group that presents programs in Fall and Spring. This year for the first time, the college hosted a *Messiah* sing- along with a really great chamber orchestra. It's sort of a come as you are party, but we had over 125 singers and succeeded in running all the major Christmas selections without serious injury to anyone! I got to sit next to a first year student, who knew my daughter (who attends Davidson and plays field hockey) and was singing the *Messiah* for the first time in his life.

In addition, there are a few small audition groups that form for short seasons and specialize in period music from Renaissance and forward. I have not listened to them, but I understand they are quite good. For these, one needs to travel a little farther afield to Charlotte.

Both Davidson and Mooresville have very nice downtowns that are resurging with local eateries, shops and boutiques - very much like Old Towne Fredericksburg though without the huge colonial and Civil War ties. Mooresville has a gem of a facility with ball rooms and an auditorium. Something that Fredericks sadly lacks at the moment.

That old saying that says we should appreciate what we have on a daily basis comes to mind often and I'd like to remind us of the really unique aspects of the Fredericksburg scene. Here comes my quick thought in stream-of-consciousness-mode: SRCS scholarships; themed galas with music, fun and food; local pro and amateur musicians who collaborate to support the arts and present great music that's also fun; Carl's ice-cream, Olde Towne; nearly magical SRCS Christmas concerts; the awesome local musicians affiliated with the military music organizations who teach here locally and also perform here; volunteers who are willing to not only rehearse and sing, but also produce and support music events.

As I continue to settle into life in North Carolina, I will no doubt become more involved with the local music scene with my church and community. Through it all, I'll hold my SRCS memories dear and look for ways to help keep the priceless treasure of music thriving where I am living.
